## State Government gives green light to multi-billion dollar Ella Bay development

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ELLA Bay developer Rod Lamb has expressed his "total relief" at yesterday's announcement by the Queensland Co-ordinator General, rubber stamping the much anticipated \$1.4 billion integrated resort development to the north of Flying Fish Point.

In what amounted to nothing less than a glowing endorsement from the State Government, Premier Campbell Newman yesterday called a special press conference in Brisbane to herald what he said was "believed to be the largest ever tourism project to be approved in Queensland'

Mr Newman told journalists that the

advice both he and Deputy Premier Jeff Seeney had received from the Coordinator General was that "the proponent has put forward as close as he has ever seen to a model proposal" for the development on the 470ha former cattle station, which is fringed by World Heritage rainforest and magnificent tropical beaches.

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## Developer relieved

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Speaking with the Innisfail Advocate immediately following the announcement. Mr Lamb, the chemical engineer turned developer with strong links to Australia's cashed-up mining industry, was clearly overioved.

"After seven years of work on it, it's total relief that it's been approved by the Co-ordinator General," Mr Lamb said.

"It's been a long time coming and there were a few compliments that they paid, in terms of being a model project.

"It's a real compliment to the work that we've done and it obviously recognises the environmental approach that


we've taken."
